WOMEN AGAINST EIGHT-HOUR LAW.

**Also Take the Side of Fallen Women
Against the Court Fee Fiend.**

At the monthly meeting of the Women's Alliance at the Palmer House yesterday the resolution was adopted against the enforcement of the eight-hour factory law now being contested by the manufacturers' association. The alliance held that the law only applied to female operators, and as they were paid mainly by piece work it was unjust to deprive them of the two extra hours a day permitted to the male operators. A resolution was also adopted thanking Mayor Hopkins for instructing the police not to make any more wholesale arrests of disreputable women, on the ground that these arrests were made for the purpose of securing fees to court officers and professional bailees.
