IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF COOK COUNTY. TO THE HONORALE, THE JUDGES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE COUNTY OF COOK, IN THE STATE OF ILLINGIS;

IN CHANCERY SITTING:

Your oratrix, Plorence K. Wischnewetzky, of thicago, Gook County, Illindia, respectfully represents unto your honors, that she is an actual resident of the maid county of Gook and has been for more than sight years last past a resident of the maid county of Gook and state of Illindis; that on the 17th day of October, 1884, at Zurich in the republic of Switzerland, she was lasfully married to one Jazare Wischnewetzky, the defondant hereinsfor named and has had by him three children, that is to say, Nicholas Wischnewetzky, now aced about fifteen years, Margaret Wischnewetzky, now aced about thirteen years, and John Sartram Wischnewetzky, now aced about two years; that since her intermarriage with the maid Lazare Wischnewetzky, she has always behaved herealf towards him as a chaste, dutiful and affectionate wire.

Your oratrix further represents that the said Lazare Wischnewetzky, wholly disregarding his marriage works and obligations towards your oratrix, has since said marriage been guilty of extreme and repeated crusity towards your oratrix; that is to say that the said Lazare Wischnewstrky on divers days and times since said marriage has beaten and struck her, and particularly that on or about January 9th, 1801, at their home in the city and state of New York, the said Lazare Wischnewstrky struck your oratrix several violent blows in and about the face, so that the face of your oratrix was disfigured and discolored and so remained for a long time thereafter, and other

wise greatly injured your oratrix; and that afterwards on or about December 27th, 1891, at the same place the said Lazare Wischnewetzky again attacked your oratrix and struck, and spat upon, your oratrix in a violent manner and otherwise ill-treated her and said to her that he should continue to beat her and should teach their said son Nicholas to heat her; and at divers other times the said Lazare Wischnewetzky has struck and beaten your oratrix in a violent manner; and on each of said occasions, and on numerous other occasions, has used toward your oratrix in the presence of their said children the most obscene, profane, abusive and opprobrious larguage: that, so great and intelerable became the said cruelty and misconduct of the said Lazare Wischnewetzky towards your oratrix that she was compelled to, and did, leave the said Lazare Wischnewetzky and their said home on or about December 27th, 1891, taking with her their said children, and has ever since then remained away from the said Lazare Wischnewetzky and kept and retained the care and custody of their said children; that the maiden name of your orabrix prior to her said marriage with the said Lazare Wischnewetzky was Florence Kelley and your oratrix wishes to resume her said maiden name.

Porasmuch, therefore, as your oratrix is without remedy in the premises except in a court of equity; and to the end that the end larare WischneweizX, who is made party defendant to this bill of complaintings be required to make full, direct and true answer to the same, but not under oath, the answer under oath being hereby expressly wal ed, that your oratrix may be divorted and forever freed from the bonds of matrimony new existing between your oratrix and the said famere Wischnewetzky; that the care, custody and education of the said children of your oratrix and the said Larare Wischnewe etaky may be avanded to your oratrix; that your oratrix may be per-

mitted by the decree of this honorable Court to resume her said maiden name, to wit: the name of Florence Kelley; and that your oratrix may have such other and further relief in the premises as equity may require and to your honors shall seem meet.

May it please your honors to grant the writ of summons in characery,directed to the sheriff of the said county of cock,commanding him that he summon the defendant to appear before the said court on the first day of the July,1900,term thereof, to be held at the court house in Chicago in the said county of Cock,then and there to auswort this bill,etc.
