DEAR SIR:

I hereby file an application for admission to the Senior class of the law school, with the hope of graduation at the close of the present collegiate year.

I made my Bachelor degree at Cornell in 1882, and then read with my father (Judge Kelley of Pennsylvania) the following works; Blackstone, Story on the Constitution, Kent's Commentaries, Wheaton on the Law of Nations, Hallam's Constitutional History of England, Stubb's Constitutional History of England, Bagehot's English Constitution, Schouler on the Domestic Relations, Simpson on Infants, Greenleaf (Vol.1) on Evidence.

In September, 1883, I entered the University of Zurich, and remained a student there until 1885, hearing lectures on the Pandekten und Institutionen by Schneider as my Hauptfach, and on Verwaltungslehre by Platter, and on Staatslehre by Orelli as Nebenfächer. I did not, however, undertake the examination for a degree.

In the Spring of 1892, I entered the law school of the Northwestern University, and was permitted to take the third-term work of the Junior year, the work above specified being accepted in lieu

of two terms' work. I completed the study of ~~Bishop~~ on Criminal Law and Bispham on Equity, but did not attend all the recitations of the term, because my position as expert for the U.S. Department of Labor came to require my whole time and strength.

For more than a year, I have been the responsible head of the Illinois State Factory Inspectors and, in that capacity, have found it my duty to spend a very large part of my time in the courts, in the prosecution of the quasi-criminal offences created by the statute under which I am appointed. Thirteen cases under this law are now pending before the Supreme Court of this State, and minor suits arise daily under my supervision.

It seems desirable that I should become qualified as promptly as possible for the prosecution of these suits; and I should be grateful for an opportunity to arrange a course in those subjects in which I have done no work, and to submit a thesis on the Employers' Liability in the United States.

I submit my two official reports and the thesis (on a legal subject) presented for my degree at Cornell, and afterward published in the International Review for November, 1882.
